Water: A Critical Issue

Water is one of our most precious natural resources. Yet, the world's water resources have been degraded at an alarming rate — with serious impacts to people, nature, and economies.

- 2.2 billion people lack access to safe drinking water.
- More than 60% of wetlands have disappeared since 1900.
- Water insecurity costs global economies about US\$500 billion per year.

Climate change has disrupted the water cycle, intensifying the crisis. Today, water-related disasters account for more than 90% of all disasters on Earth.

The water crisis is also a crisis of human dignity and equity. People of color, Indigenous groups, and low-income communities often experience climate change impacts first and worst — and often have the fewest resources to adapt.

For nearly 40 years, the Pacific Institute has conducted groundbreaking research and pioneered water resilience solutions. We also convene and collaborate with diverse partners in the United States and globally to drive meaningful and lasting changes:

- Influencing shifts in water policies at the state, federal, and global level.
- Galvanizing a coalition of more than 350 companies across 140 countries to take action on water.
- Catalyzing action in 100 water-stressed basins around the world.
